
This scintillating volume takes readers on an exclusive journey through Paris, guided by Mathilde Favier—the charismatic public relations director at Dior Couture.

Lauded by the FT's How to Spend It as "one of the world's best antique and vintage furniture stores," Galerie Half offers a stylish blend of twentieth century design, European antiques, and eclectic rarities.

A favorite purveyor to the Los Angeles design cognoscenti, Galerie Half is imbued with a sense of timeless imperfection. Pieces from disparate design traditions converge seamlessly in a single room: a bleached Gustavian daybed is flanked by a Roman statue, a Venetian mirror reflects African masks, and a rustic farmhouse table is framed by caned chairs. Galerie Half is talented at constructing such diverse compositions. A vivid hue can create synchronicity between the timeworn patina of a glazed terracotta planter and the softened leather of an Advocat and Press chair by Le Corbusier-Pierre Jeanneret. A monochromatic palette of contrasting textures can ground a room, creating harmony between luxurious and humble materials, or signed and anonymous designs. Similarly, complementary shapes can provide balance—the horizontal stripes on a Finnish floor lamp echo those in Marcel Breuer's 1932 armchair, and the seductive curve of the Suora floor lamp mimics that of Rick Owen's marble stool. The genius of Galerie Half and the celebrity homes that they have appointed lies in this artful curation of individual elements with soul.

The transcendent gallery is a haven for Los Angeles interior designers and star Hollywood clientele, including Jason and Amanda Anka Bateman, Ellen Degeneres, Mary-Kate and Ashley Olsen, and Rosie Huntington Whitely and Jason Statham.

Cameron Smith is a collector and cofounder of Galerie Half. Kathe and Tommy Clements run Clements Design. Rosa Park is the cofounder and editor in chief of *Cereal* magazine and founding director of Francis Gallery. Shade Degges, a lifestyle photographer, regularly contributes to *Architectural Digest*.





Embarking readers on a prodigious journey, the jewelry showcased in this book explores the Maison's iconic fields of expression: essential lines, geometry, colors, flora and fauna, and influences from world cultures, to name but a few. The renowned jeweler continually pushes the boundaries of creation to discover new horizons.

Accompanied by text focusing on the concept of style in the arts, the pieces presented in this richly illustrated volume take us on a renewed journey—a *voyage recommencé*—into the heart of the Cartier style, where creative imagination and superlative savoir faire transform precious stones and materials into magnificent jewelry.

YVES SAINT LAURENT: FLORA

Flowers in every form inspired fashion designer Yves Saint Laurent, serving as a leitmotif in his work. His passion for plants manifested itself in countless patterns and techniques, and he adorned women in floral appliqués, prints, and embroideries. From a thousand and one rose buds to sprigs of lily of the valley, from an avalanche of bougainvillea to delicate poppy touches, and from sheaves of wheat to majestic lilies, nature was an essential part of his visual palette.

Through the discerning eyes of Olivier Saillard, this veritable garden of Yves Saint Laurent's designs—culled from a broad range of styles—metamorphoses into a bouquet of flowering silhouettes. Under the direction of Elsa Janssen and Alexis Sornin, essays from Emanuele Coccia, Marc Jeanson, and Serena Bucalo Mussely explore, respectively, the symbolism of flowers, characteristics of his recurring prints, and the designer's signature use of flora in accessories.

This book accompanies a duo of exhibitions at the Musées Yves Saint Laurent in Paris and Marrakesh in 2024 and 2025.

Olivier Saillard, director of the Fondation Azzedine Alaïa and former director of the Palais Galliera, is a fashion historian, curator, and author. **Emanuele Coccia**, philosopher,

university lecturer, and author of *The Life of Plants*, specializes in the relationship between visual theory and the nature of life. Botanist **Marc Jeanson** is former director of the museum of natural history in Paris and former botany director of the Majorelle Garden in Marrakesh. **Serena Bucalo Mussely,** chief curator and art historian, is head of collections at the Musée Yves Saint Laurent Paris.





This new cookbook focuses on bread and *viennoiserie*, the category of French baked goods traditionally enjoyed for breakfast (like croissants and *pains au chocolat*); it is a perfect complement to Ferrandi's bestselling French Pâtisserie, which covers baked desserts. Here, the culinary school's team of experienced chef instructors provides more than 40 techniques, explained in 220 step-by-step instructions—from making your own poolish or levain to kneading, shaping, and scoring various types of loaves, and from laminating butter to braiding brioches. Base recipes for doughs, fillings, and classic *viennoiserie* provide fundamental building blocks.

Organized into four categories—traditional breads, specialty breads, *viennoiserie*, and sandwiches—the 83 easy-to-follow recipes provide home chefs with sweet and savory options for breakfast or snacks—from country bread to grissini, pastrami bagels to croque-monsieurs, and kougelhopf to beignets. Select gluten-free, vegetarian, and vegan recipes offer something for everyone. A general introduction explains the fundamentals of bread and *viennoiserie* making, including key ingredients, the importance of gluten, the steps of fermentation, and an informative glossary.

Ferrandi Paris opened in 1920 to train culinary and hospitality professionals. Internationally renowned for excellence, the school offers courses of all levels to students from France and abroad, including master classes taught by celebrated Michelin-starred chefs. With Flammarion, Ferrandi Paris has published *French Pâtisserie* (2017), *Chocolate* (2019), *Vegetables* (2020), *Fruits and Nuts* (2022), and *Charcuterie* (2023).



ANTIQUE FRENCH JEWELRY: 1800–1950

This comprehensive overview, organized by material and period, allows the reader to distinguish, appraise, and date French jewelry from 1800–1950.

This highly accessible guide offers a detailed panorama charting the evolution of French jewelry created between the Consulate period in the 1800s through to the 1950s. Iconic examples include Onyx cameos, ''dormeuses'' earrings in rose gold, an Art Deco solitaire, a sapphire ''you and me'' ring, a diamond ''shaker'' brooch, and an emerald ''negligee'' necklace.

Entries are organized by period, and include primary sources of inspiration and characteristics, designers, materials, gemstones, and types of jewelry. Completed with an overview of the key design houses and artists who have left their mark on the jewelry industry since 1800, along with detailed advice for buying and maintaining pieces, this practical reference—richly illustrated with photographs and archival documents—provides everything you need to know to appreciate antique jewelry in all its facets.

Victoire de Castellane is artistic director of Dior Jewelry. Geoffray Riondet runs the Riondet design house, and is an antique jewelry specialist, legal expert, and gemologist. Riondet drew upon the expertise of Valérie Goupil, Anne Laurent, Loïc Lescuyer, Gérard Panczer, and Brigitte Serre-Bourt, professors at the French National Institute of Gemology (ING, Paris-Lyon).

CHILDREN IN IMPRESSIONIST ART

The impressionist artists accorded great importance to family life, frequently portraying their own mothers, wives, and progeny in scenes of maternity and childhood.

The impressionist masters were known for their close relationships; peers, family, art dealers, and patrons all featured regularly in their artworks, and children were favored subjects. All aspects of childhood and family life at the end of the nineteenth century—maternity, nannies, education, games, animals, adolescence—were depicted in the works of Pierre-Auguste Renoir, Claude Monet, Camille Pissarro, Mary Cassatt, Berthe Morisot, and others. This volume draws an intimate portrait of the everyday lives of these artists and their families.







This book retraces forty years in the creative career of Thomas Bastide. The designer and sculptor has collaborated with prestigious French and international companies, including Baccarat, Hennessy, and Christofle, and this volume pays tribute to the unique techniques that he has contributed to the fields of crystal glassmaking, goldsmithery, and porcelain-making.

Featuring the themes that are fundamental to the artist's work, such as equilibrium, deconstruction, mechanics, and fluidity, this volume invites readers to discover an exceptional savoir faire combining creativity, technical prowess, resilience, and dexterity. The text paints an authentic, vivacious, yet humble portrait of Bastide, and his anecdotes accompany photographs by Jo Pesendorfer of a selection of his works.

Born in 1954, **Thomas Bastide** grew up watching Scandinavian master glassmakers at work, and glass—with the multiple creative possibilities it offers—has become a true passion for him. A graduate from the Penninghen School of Graphic Arts and ENSAAMA in Paris, and the Pilchuck School in Seattle, he began his professional career with Raymond Loewy, a star of the design world. **Laure Verchère** was a long-time journalist for *Elle Décoration*. She is the author of numerous books, including *Signed Sybille de Margerie* and *Le Grand Hôtel & Café de la Paix*, published by Flammarion.
