



In the new novel from the author of Assembly, a viral long-read exposé raises more questions than it answers.


Remember – words are your weapons, they're your tools, your currency.

Universality is a twisty, slippery descent into the rhetoric of truth and power. Through a voyeuristic lens, it focuses on words: what we say, how we say it, and what we really mean. The follow-up novel to Natasha Brown's *Assembly* is a compellingly nasty celebration of the spectacular force of language. It dares you to look away.




ALEXANDER BARON

'Coy' then breaks apart Andrew Marvell's 'To His Coy Mistress' and repurposes its lexicon to enact the collapse of language under the strain of scalding direct statement. Finally, in the luminous title sequence, crystals and gemstones evoke fracture and fixative, demonstrating Scott's power as a poet to cast an uncompromising but ultimately uplifting light: 'For years I had no sound but his sweetness, his lye. // Thus I go slow. I song last. Least. The lower. // That which I had nor sound I may still song'.



RICHARD SCOTT was born in London in 1981. His debut collection. Soho. was shortlisted for the T.S. Eliot Prize, the Forward Prize for Best First Collection and the Polari First Book Prize. 

Bernard O'Donoghue investigates the idea of anchorage as a place we build for ourselves out of memory and story. The Ireland of his youth is rich in colour and precise in detail, and while he acknowledges the power of the past, he also brings it into question: 'I wish I'd never started on this story; / It may have been a dream, or maybe not . . .' O'Donoghue's informal, even playful tone is that of a poet disarming themselves as well as their reader. He is neither plaintive nor nostalgic but confronts the possibility that what you are most attached to can be, in the end, what ties you down. The poems also enact the reluctance to return that arises out of a fear of finding yourself locked out.



BERNARD O'DONOGHUE was born in Cullen, Co. Cork, in 1945. His poetry collections include *Gunpowder*, winner of the 1995 Whitbread Prize for Poetry, and *The Seasons of Cullen Church*, shortlisted for the 2016 T. S. Eliot Prize. His *Selected Poems* was published by Faber in 2008. He is currently translating *Piers Plowman* for Faber.



Nature Matters Mona Arshi and Karen McCarthy Woolf

A vibrant anthology that redefines what a nature poem can be.

The rise of nature writing as a cultural phenomenon is nothing new. Yet it has stirred questions relating to whose voices are heard in a space predominantly occupied by Western European traditions and writers. In *Nature Matters*, poets Mona Arshi and Karen McCarthy Woolf seek to redress this imbalance. Their genre-enriching anthology presents nature poetry from contemporary writers of the diaspora while giving a sense of chronology and antecedent.



The poems of *Dwell* were inspired by the Lost Gardens of Heligan, an ambitious Cornish restoration project where history and mystery combine. The reawakened landscape with its woods, meadows and 'jungle' offers a fertile realm for all sorts of creatures. Simon Armitage uses elements of riddle and folklore to animate a series of dwellings: the 'twig-and-leaf crow's-nest squat' of a squirrel's drey, a beaver lodge's 'spillikin stave church', a hive's 'reactor core'.

Distinctions between human and animal, natural and cultivated, are blurred, underlining commonality and creating a vibrant account of 'non-stop stop-motion life'. *Dwell* warns of the fragility of these spaces, exposed to endless and sadly familiar environmental threats. Just as a garden provides refuge for wildlife, so do these intricate poems offer lasting homes to those who dwell within their lines.
