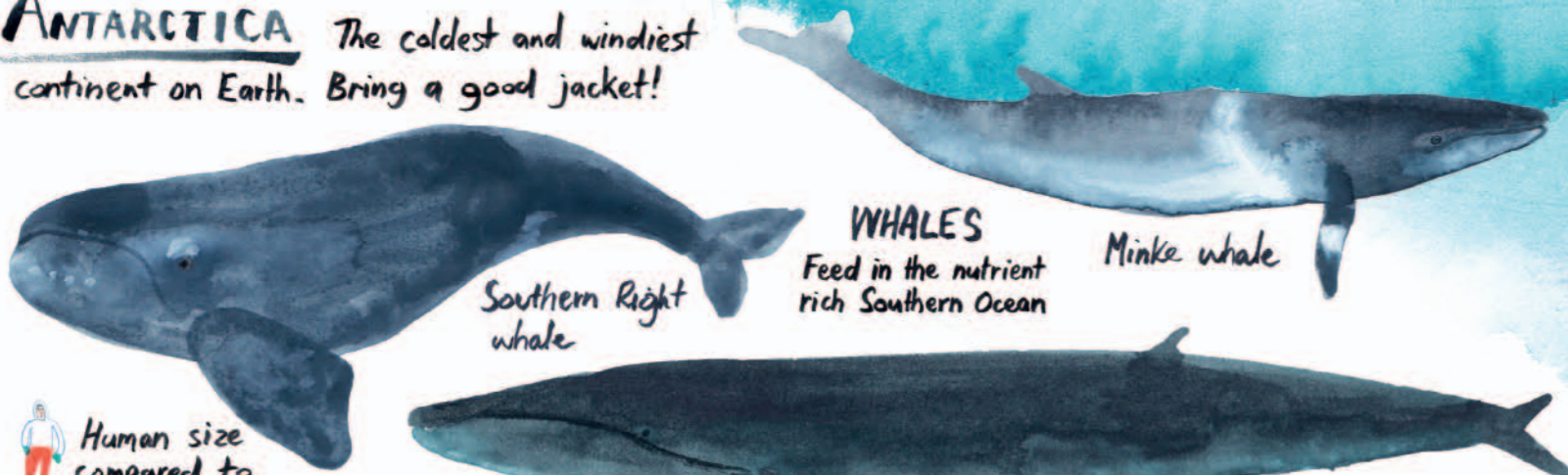

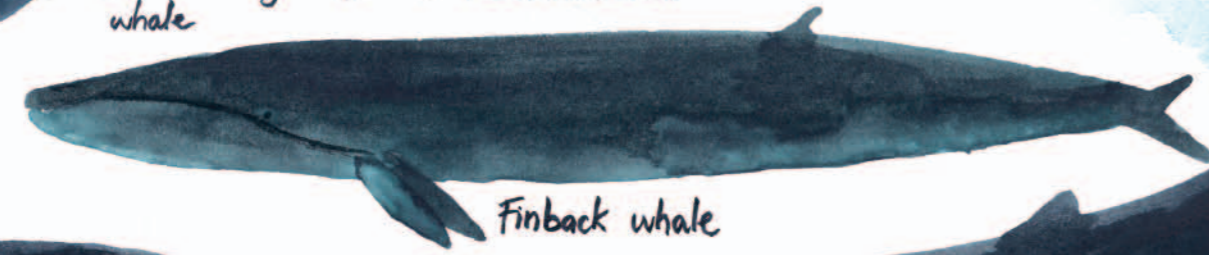


Southern Right whale

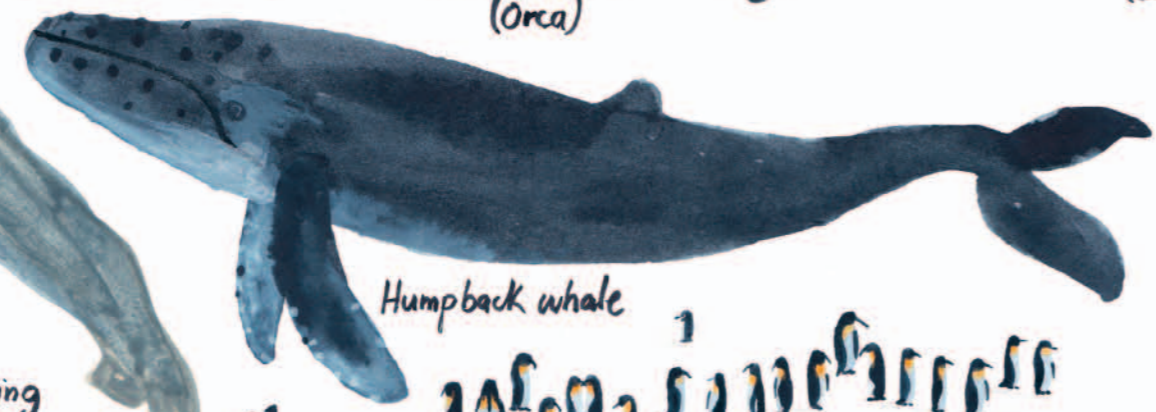

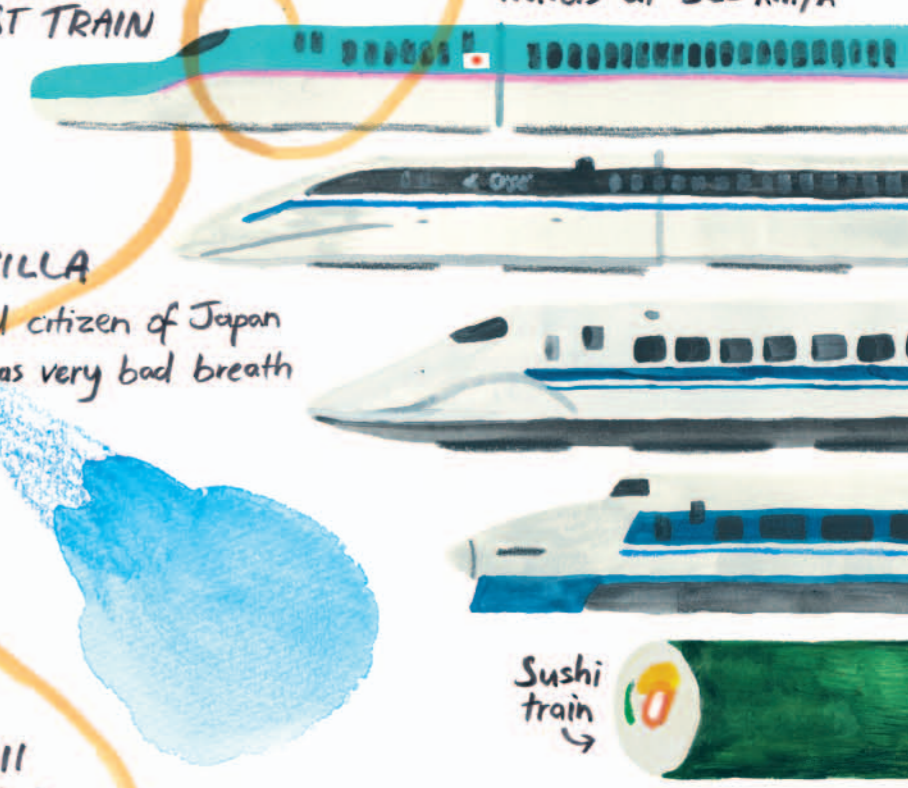

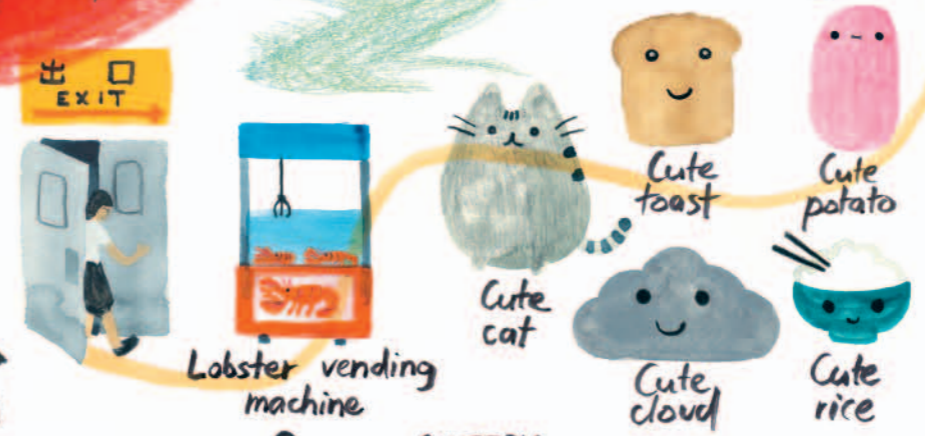

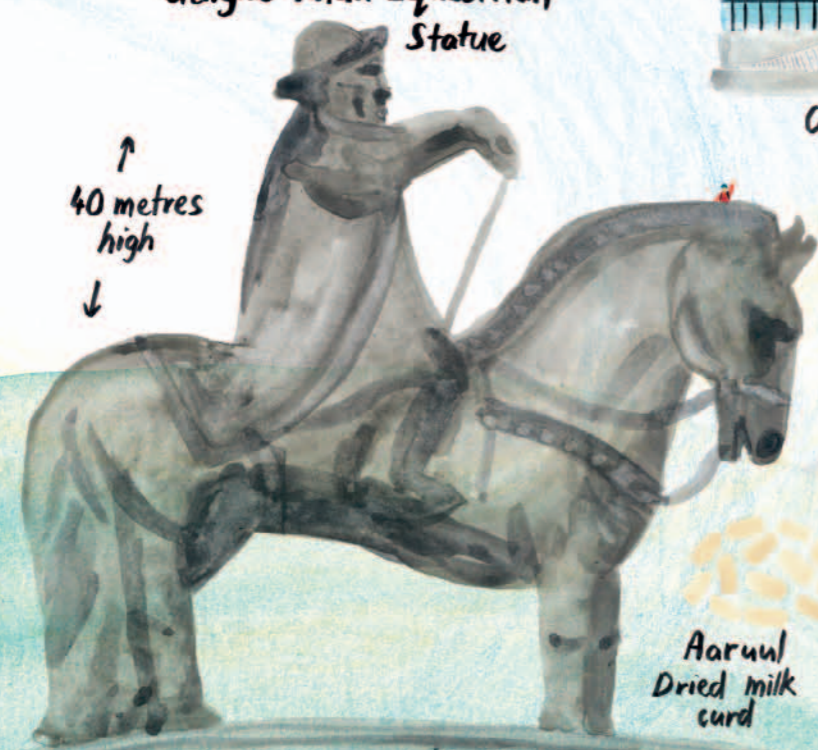
ULAANBAATAR

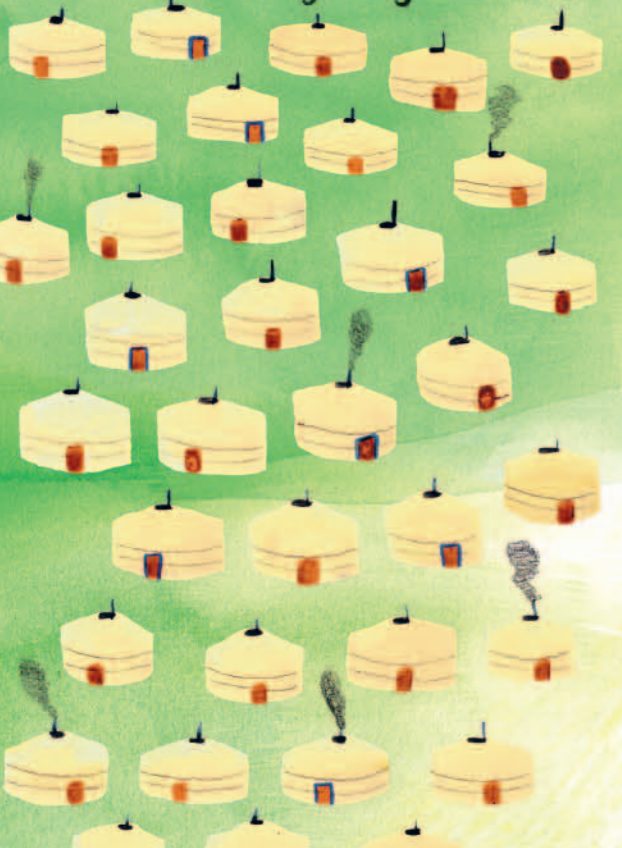

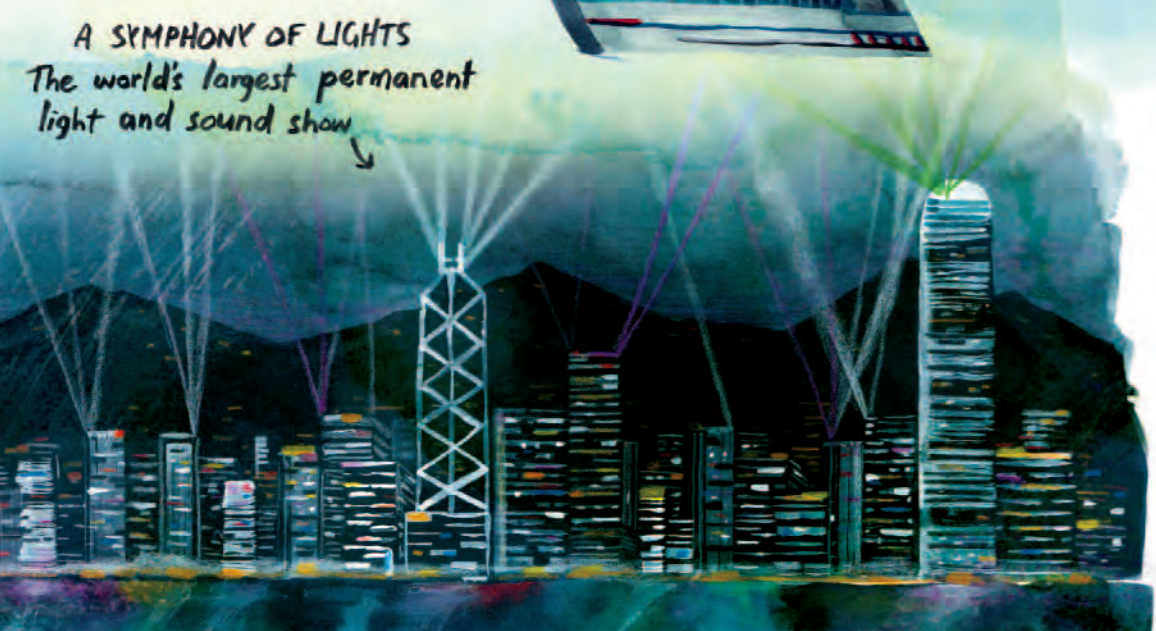

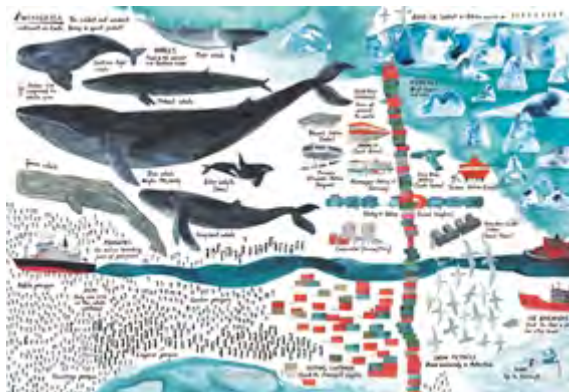
