

1979 BOVA FUTURA — BUS

The Bova Futura bus was designed in 1979 by Axel Enthoven in collaboration with Ton Baeten. The Dutch bus manufacturer VDL Groep began production in 1981, ceasing 31 years later, after 11,218 units of the Bova Futura had been made. The main design updates were named Futura 2 (1988) and Futura 3 (1998). The bus is manufactured under licence in China by Zhongtong Bus Holding. The design won several awards, including the 1986 RAI Coach of the Year Award, the 1995 KIDP Good Design Award, the 2001 Design Prestige Prize of the Design Centre of the Czech Republic, and the prestigious Red Dot Award that same year.

The Bova Futura bus can easily be seen as the most innovative product that I ever put on the market because this bus really provoked a big shock in the field of bus construction. It is a unique story, the design remaining almost unchanged for 31 years.





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My father was a furniture maker and was very interested in woodwork and particular constructions. Axel was a very young designer who wanted to prove himself and I was an ambitious fellow in the marketing and sales department of my father's company. It is out of that mix of knowledge and energy that the Bora Bora was born.

The Bora Bora is a very elegant product with a high level of seating comfort which contained hardly any volume, so that no unnecessary quantities of foam had to be fitted in it. It was in fact an ecological product before it became fashionable.

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I designed a chair that was very difficult to make but with which he could very clearly demonstrate his craft. I really wanted to sublimate their skill, which is why we also called it Opus. I have to say that it is one of the most puristic chairs that I have ever designed.
